



Getting started with BioWash

BioWash100 is the flagship product on which all the other products are based.

Wash your hands with it

Take your bottle of BioWash100, open the bottle, press your palm down on the top, turn the bottle and return it upright, leaving a tiny residue on your hand. Then use water and wash your hands with BioWash. BioWash is gentle on skin but will remove dirt, oil, grease and even tar. There are no toxins of any kind in BioWash; it is completely safe for people and animals.

Pour it on plant roots

Next, get a bucket of either 4 gallons, 2 gallons or 1 gallon of unchlorinated water by either using a Chlorine filter or leaving the water to stand for 24 hours. Add BioWash 100 in the dilutions listed here and stir. (Use 4 times the amounts for BioWash 25)

1 ounce BW	or	30 ml	or	2 tablespoons	to	4 gallons water
1/2 ounce BW	or	15 ml	or	1 tablespoon	to	2 gallons water
1/4 ounce BW	or	8 ml	or	1 1/2 teaspoons	to	1 gallon water

Find one or more plants, especially ones that are struggling and drench their roots. Watch these plants for 3 weeks while maintaining normal watering. Then use BioWash mixed with water soluble fertilizer every few weeks for optimum results.

Spray it on a plant leaves, stems and branches

Add this mixture to a spray bottle and spray on plant leaves and stems (not on flowers) and wait 3 weeks. (Delicate plants, like orchids, need a more diluted solution.)

Use it as a spray cleaner

Add your mixture to a spray bottle to 1/3 filled and then add 2/3 water. Use this spray cleaner on surfaces like appliances, countertops, windows, bathroom surfaces to leave disinfected surfaces without toxic chemicals and irritating fumes. You can control the strength of the cleaner by controlling the level of dilution.
